Race and Stratification in U.S. College Enrolment over Time

Daniel Klasik is assistant professor at the George Washington University. He earned his Ph.D. in Education Policy and M.A. in Economics at Stanford University. He completed his postdoctoral work with the Maryland Equity Project at the College of Education at the University of Maryland. His research uses a wide variety of quantitative methods to study student pathways into and through postsecondary education. His ongoing research topics span how students make decisions about whether and where to attend college; how students' college decision-making process shapes later college and life outcomes; and the effect of affirmative action and other admissions policies on campus diversity.
