Meran is located at the base of three valleys that shelter it and provide with a mild climate and clean air. For this reason it was suggested by doctors as a "winter health resort", and it became a holiday destination of many important personalities, such as Franz Kafka and Sigmund Freud and his family. Dobbiaco is a small town in Val Pusteria. Apart from its natural beauty, the town is famous for its connection with the composer Gustav Mahler, who spent his summers from 1908 to 1910 in Dobbiaco. Here he composed "Das Lied von der Erde" and Symphony No. 10. To honor the artist, whose monument you can still see in the center of the town, Dobbiaco holds every summer the "Gustav Mahler Music Weeks".

Moena is connected to Ladin culture. A legend tells that Ladinia, daughter of the king Laurinio, decided to stop and live in Moena, amazed by the beauty of the place. Verona is the chief town in Veneto. It is connected to the story of Romeo and Juliet and for this it is known as the city of the lovers. How to arrive at the Novacella Abbey

By Train:

Purchase a ticket to South Tyrol through Trenitalia (https://www.trenitalia.com/en.html). The nearest stop to Novacella Abbey is the "Bressanone/Brixen" stop.

International companies serving South Tyrol include Deutsche Bahn (https://int.bahn.de/en) and ÖBB (https://www.nightjet.com/en/#/home). They provide transportation to Brenner Pass, where you can then board trains to Bressanone/Brixen.

The Abbey is located at c. 5 km from the railway station in Bressanone/Brixen.

At the station, you can either take a **taxi** (the price is c. 12€) or a bus. The following **bus lines from the railway station in Bressanone/Brixen** to the Abbey are available:

- Line 320.4, stop at "Novacella, Abbazia" and walk for 1 minute;
- Line 401, stop at "Novacella, Pacher" and walk for 10 minutes;
- Lines 310, 320.1, 326, stop at "Varna, Vicolo Defregger" and walk for 15 minutes;
- Citybus lines 2 or 3, stop at "Abbazia di Novacella".

By Plane:

The nearest airports to Novacella Abbey include:

- **Bolzano/Bozen** Airport (50 km). Bus lines 10A and 10B will take you to Bolzano/Bozen railway station, where you can catch trains to Bressanone/Brixen. However, only a few companies fly here.
- Innsbruck Airport (82 km). Bus line F (Innsbruck Flughafen) will take you to Innsbruck railway station, offering connections to Bressanone/Brixen.
- Verona Valerio Catullo Airport (190km). Take airport bus line 199 to Verona Porta Nuova railway station, where you can board trains to Bressanone/Brixen.

By Bus:

Flixbus (https://www.flixbus.it/) provides transportation from many European cities to South Tyrol. Stop in Bressanone/Brixen and take the local bus. The following bus lines from the Flixbus stop to the Abbey are available:

- Lines 320.2, 320.4, stop at "Novacella, Abbazia" and walk for 1 minute;
- Lines 328, 401, stop at "Novacella, Pacher" and walk for 10 minutes;
- Lines 310, 326, stop at "Varna, Vicolo Defregger" and walk for 15 minutes.

By Car:

From the Brennero Highway A22, take the "Bressanone/Val Pusteria" exit and follow the brown signs for "Kloster Neustift"/"Abbazia Novacella". Turn right towards Vahrn/Varna, continue along the main street through the village and turn left at Hotel Lowenhof towards Neustift. After 1 km, you will arrive at the Abbey. There is a free parking area after the bridge over the Isarco/Eisack River.
