#### Abstract of the Workshop:

The workshop’s goal is to give the students an in depth understanding of strategies, approaches and standard procedures, as well as best practices coming out from INTERSOS experience, about intervention in emergency in complex humanitarian crisis. Beyond the classification and theory about humanitarian emergencies, analysis and aid, the practical experience of the only “single mandate” Italian NGO will help the students to understand the general context, main elements for a good response strategy but also tools for implementation. The simulation based on real experience (Ukraine crisis) and working groups (Yemen, Syria) will facilitate the analysis of different methods and approaches.

### “EU Foreign Policy in 2030 - in Asia and beyond”



#### Instructor:

Stefania Benaglia - Head of the Global Connectivity Programme

#### Short bio:

Stefania Benaglia is the Head of the Global Connectivity Programme at CEPS. Her research focuses on Connectivity and EU relations in the Indo-Pacific, where she also consults in Senior/Team Leader roles. Stefania is a frequent commentator at leading media and regularly briefs senior policymakers – including the European Parliament and various European Prime Minister’s offices. Stefania is also an experienced Public Diplomacy expert and has worked extensively in Track 2 and Track 1,5 formats, mostly – though not exclusively – between the EU and third countries. Between 2014 and 2017, she lived in India, working on EU-India defence cooperation for Istituto Affari Internazionali (IAI) and Friedrich Ebert Stiftung (FES). Previously Stefania worked in the European Commission Political & Security Committee team and then represented the EC at the Politico-Military Group and the NATO Parliamentary Assembly.

#### Abstract of the Workshop:

The workshop’s goal is to give the students an in depth understanding of the future of EU foreign policy in Asia and beyond. The workshop will be divided into two sessions. In the first session, the instructor will introduce students to the empirical and theoretical context that shape’s the EU’s engagement with Asia, with a specific focus on different domains of foreign policy. In the second session, the instructor will organise a foresight exercise, likely asking students to draw two scenarios: 1) the global politics future they want, and 2) the future they likely consider to happen. The instructor will then lead an exercise on what should happen, from an EU foreign policy point of view, to pass from scenario 2 to scenario 1.

### “Open-Source Intelligence (OSINT) Investigations”

#### Instructor:

Leone Hadavi

#### Short bio:

Leone Hadavi is an open source investigator, consultant and trainer, particularly focused on the analysis, recognition and tracking of armaments, vehicles and other strategic means of transportation. He is currently a senior investigator with the Myanmar Witness project of the Center for Information Resilience - where he heads the Arms Team - and the lead analyst for the EUArms project of Lighthouse Reports. With a background in security studies and international law, Leone aimed at filling and understanding the gap between the practical and theoretical sides within a conflict situation. He has interned at international tribunals where he first applied OSINT techniques to better analyse more dynamic and fast-changing conflict and criminal dynamics.

#### Abstract of the Workshop:

##### *REMOTE INSTRUCTOR*

With the rise of digital technology globally, including the widespread use of smartphones and social media networks, Open-Source Intelligence (OSINT) skills and techniques are key tools to understand and analyze an increasing data-centric and digitalized world. Whether it be for the purpose of collecting evidence of human rights abuses or international crimes, observing natural disasters, or assessing the impact of military activities, OSINT is an ever-so-demanding asset. The course aims to provide students with introductory OSINT tools and techniques to exploit data and information available online. The outline will follow an initial theoretical approach to key aspects of OSINT followed back-to-back by practical and hands-on exercises to be carried out by the students, supervised by an experienced trainer. The examples the students will be walked through originate from real investigations into human rights violations, arms transfer and armed conflict scenarios. At the end of the course students will be able to approach problems with an inquisitive mindset and creative attitude, to conduct basic searches and verification of online data – including imagery – to analyze and cross-reference the result of their research through multiple platforms.
